1 Tokyo Station

The Tokyo Station brick station building was restored to its original appearance in October of 2012, taking pains to preserve the original historical building as much possible. During the Meiji Era a number of brick buildings were constructed modeled after Lombard Street in London. As the entway to Tokyo, Tokyo Station is becoming an area of refined and sophisticated facilities and establishments including restaurants, shops, and more.

The postmodern cylindrical tower of the store is a symbol of Shibuya.

As one of the three Great Buddha statues in Japan, this Great Buddha seems to have different facial expressions depending on changes in the natural surroundings. 58 Tomioka Silk Mill World Heritage

The Japanese government first established this silk mill in 1872 to help with the modernization of Japan. With the ultimate goal of exporting high-quality silk, this mill was established as a model factory equipped with modern, Western-style silk-reeling machines to foster productivity and train instructors on technique. Production ceased in 1987 as a result of low demand for raw silk and other factors. The main original buildings such as the silk-reeling mill and the cocoon warehouses are still preserved in excellent, nearly original condition. The mill was registered as a World Heritage Site in 2014.

Mount Akagi is a collection of mountains featuring Mount Kurobi, which is the highest point of this mountain at 1,828 meters. At the top of the mountain is a crater lake known as Onuma Lake. Kakumanzufuchi is a high more beside the lake where visitors can see rare alpine plants. There are hiking trails that take 2-3 hours to travel and enjoy different experiences in each season. Visitors can then relax after a day of hiking at the Akagi Hot Spring, which has long been known as the Joshi Medicated Bath.

61 Mt.Fuji World Heritage

At 3,776 meters above sea level, Mt. Fuji was registered as a World Heritage Site in 2013. There are four main routes available to climb the mountain, which can take anywhere from 4 hours 30 minutes to 7 hours 20 minutes to reach the summit. You can take a bus as far as the fifth station on Mt. Fuji. The fifth station, you can find a large tourist area that includes rest areas, restaurants, and souvenir shops.

62 Mishima Taisha Shrine

Though the actual period of construction is unknown, the venerable Mishima Taisha Shrine has been recorded in books dating back to the Nara and Heian periods. The shrine palace is designated as a cultural asset, and the large esanmushu tree in the shrine is registered as a National Natural Treasure. The Mishima Summer Festival is held in conjunction with the Reisi festivals during August from the 15th through the 17th. On the last day of the Reisi, the Yabumase performance is held in which horse-back archers fire arrows at targets as a form of ceremony. This event attracts many visitors every year.

Mount Takao, with a three-star rating from Michelin Travel, is located in a quiet national park about 50 minutes from Tokyo. There are three mountain-climbing trails. You can also reach the summit by taking the cable car from Kiyotaki Station to Takaoasan Station. Either route will take you to the summit in about 90 minutes. Some points of interest near Takaoasan Station include Monkey Park featuring over 60 monkeys, and Wildflower Garden, where you can see nearly 300 different types of wildflowers throughout the different seasons.
